## FCC RETIRED PEACE OFFICER WAIVER - LEOSA

### INSTRUCTIONS

Pursuant to PA 100-712, if an individual elects to carry a firearm pursuant to the federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004, then the agency employing the retired officer is required to submit an application to the Department along with a fee specified by rule.

Those individuals that meet this requirement will need to possess an active Permanent Employee Registration Card (PERC),\* an active Firearm Owners Identification Card (FOID), and proof of being in compliance with the federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 (LEOSA).

\*If you possess an active 115, 119, or 124 license, place this number in box 9 in lieu of the 129 number in box 7.

This completed FCC RETIRED PEACE OFFICER WAIVER-LEOSA form will then need to be mailed to the Department to the address at the top of the form along with a \$25 fee payable to IDFPR and a copy of their PERC, FOID, and LEOSA documents.

If the individual is employed by more than one agency under the Illinois Private Detective, Private Alarm, Private Security, Fingerprint Vendor and Locksmith Act of 2004, this form, fee and supporting documents will need to be submitted by each agency where employed.

NOTE: Disclosure of your U.S. social security number, if you have one, is mandatory, in accordance with 5 Illinois Compiled Statutes 100/10-65. The social security number may be provided to the Illinois Department of Public Aid to identify persons who are more than 30 days delinquent in complying with a child support order, or to the Illinois Department of Revenue to identify persons who have failed to file a tax return, pay tax, penalty or interest shown in a filed return, or to pay any final assessment or tax penalty or interest, as required by any tax Act administered by the Illinois Department of Revenue, or to other entities for verification of identification.
