ORDER ASSESSING CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

The SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL REGULATION (the "Secretary"), by and through his delegated representative having conducted an examination of facts related to For What It's Worth, 16216 S. Halsted, Harvey, IL ("For What It's Worth"), and having found that For What It's Worth (License No. PWN.298) has committed a violation of the rules related to the reporting requirements for pawnbrokers, hereby issues this ORDER pursuant to the authority provided under Section 0.05(a)(6) of the Pawnbroker Regulation Act [205 ILCS 510/0.01 et seq.] (the "Act").

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Secretary FINDS the following:

- 1. 38 Ill. Adm. Code, Section 360, comprises administrative rules related to the licensing and regulation of pawnbrokers in the State of Illinois;
- 2. Pursuant to 38 Ill. Adm. Code, Section 360.210(a), a pawnshop must file an annual report with the Department, on a form provided by the Department and entitled "Pawnshop Disclosure of Business Activities Report" ("Disclosure Report"), no later than 30 calendar days following the end of each calendar year;
- 3. As of April 20, 2009, For What It's Worth has not filed its Disclosure Report with the Department;
- 4. Section 0.05(a)(6) of the Act provides the Department the authority to assess a civil monetary penalty against any person for each violation of any provision of the Act, any rule promulgated in accordance with the Act, or any order of the Department.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Secretary CONCLUDES:

1. That by virtue of its failure to timely file its Disclosure Report for calendar year 2008, For What It's Worth violated 38 Ill. Adm. Code, Section 360.210(a).

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. For What It's Worth shall be and hereby is assessed a civil monetary penalty in the amount of \$1,000 pursuant to Section 0.05(a)(6) of the Act;
- 2. The civil monetary penalty in the amount of \$1,000 shall be paid no later than sixty (60) days after service of this order upon For What It's Worth; and
- 3. The civil monetary penalty in the amount of \$1,000 shall be paid by means of a certified check or money order made payable to the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR).
