

**DEPARTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL REGULATION
DISCIPLINARY REPORT FOR OCTOBER 1999**

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Springfield, Illinois, November 1999 -- Leonard A. Sherman, Director of the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation, announced the following disciplinary actions taken by the Department for the month of **October 1999**.

ARCHITECTURE

Michael Dyer, Charlotte, NC – architect license suspended until his Tennessee license is restored to good standing.

BARBER

Agostino Favia, Addison – barber license reprimanded and fined \$100 for practicing without a license for more than two months.

Courtney Oakley, O'Fallon – ordered to cease and desist the unlicensed practice as a barber.

MEDICAL

Emanuel Anawis, Chicago – physician and surgeon license reprimanded and fined \$1,000 for allegedly providing for the hospitalization of three persons who were allegedly participants in a scheme to create fraudulent personal injury cases.

Bennett Braun, Skokie – physician and surgeon license suspended for two years followed by probation for a minimum of five years for alleged gross negligence in the treatment of patients diagnosed with Dissociative Identity Disorders (also known as Multiple Personality Disorders) while he was Director of Dissociative Disorders Program at Rush Presbyterian-St. Lukes Hospital in Chicago.

Valerie A. Childrey, Chicago – physician and surgeon license placed on probation after defaulting on an Illinois Student Assistance loan.

Lawrence L. Ciccarelli, Terre Haute, IN – physician and surgeon license suspended for two years followed by probation for four years after being convicted of felony tax evasion.

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Joanne Falcon, Odin – ordered to cease and desist the unlicensed practice of medicine or any other health related profession.
